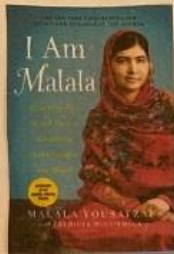


Who is Malala?

- Malala Yousafzai - born 12th July 1997 in Mingora Pakistan.
- Malala spoke out publicly about a girls right to an education.
- She was shot in the head by a gunman who was part of the Taliban.
- Malala was flown to a hospital in Birmingham where they saved her life.
- Malala and her family now live in the UK and she continues to campaign for girls education around the world.



What is the Malala Fund?

- Help campaign for girls education around the world.
- They do not build schools, but networks to challenge policies and practices that prevent girls from going to school.

Nepal Earthquake 2015 - providing aid to the victims.

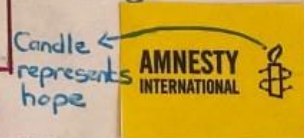
What is Seewa?
