What is a celebration?

Celebrations are an important part of human life. They are one of the things that make us uniquely human. All peoples and cultures, from every part of the world, take part in and hold celebrations to mark special events and special times in someone's life. Some celebrations may be small and personal events, such as birthdays, when the uniqueness of the individual is celebrated. Others may be very public and take place over a longer period of time. Celebrations can be powerful expressions of identity and affirm a sense of community. They also serve as a means of perpetuating traditions whether those of a family, community or a country

Some major religious celebrations:

Christianity – Epiphany, Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Pentecost, Advent, Christmas Day

Islam – Day of Hijra, Mawlid al-Nabi,Laylat al-Qadr, Eid alFitr, Dhu al-Hijja, Eid al-Adha

Judaism – Shabbat, Purim, Passover, Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Hanukkah

Buddhism – Parinirvana, Hana Matsuri, Wesak, Obon, Esala Perahera, Kathina, Nirvana Day
