

**2nd paragraph:** <u>Build up:</u> What clue is given? (Is there a warning from the gods? Is someone 'angered'? Are they jealous?)

**3rd paragraph:** <u>Dilemma:</u> What does the villain do? Appearance (e.g. half animal, serpent), actions (e.g. turn people to stone)

**4th Paragraph:** Event: Do they battle? Where? (swords, fire, axes or magic)

**5th paragraph:** Resolution: How do they defeat the villain? How do the gods react?
