National Census 2021	YouGov study on Christianity in Britain 2020 (2169 people surveyed)
Was Christian (down from 72% in 2001 and 59% in 2011)	46% of the population
Was non-religious (up from 15% in 2001 and 25% in 2011)	37% of the population
	55% surveyed are NOT members of any religion.
	41% do not believe in a god or a higher power.
	Of those who are religious, only half of them believe in God.
