Year 7: Shakespeare's Villains

Key Terms

Tragedy - a play dealing with tragic events and having an unhappy ending, especially one concerning the downfall of the main character.

Protagonist - the leading character or one of the major characters in the play.

Antagonist - a person who actively apposes or is hostile to someone or something.

Tragic Hero - a protagonist with a fatal flaw, who makes their own decisions, and makes the audience pity/fear them, usually leads to their downfall.

Blank Verse – Verse without rhyme, it does however have 10 syllables per line.

Soliloquy - an act of speaking one's thoughts aloud when by oneself or regardless of any hearers, especially by a character in a play.

Juxtaposition - two things being seen or placed Close together with contrasting effect.

Iambic pentameter- a line of verse with five metrical feet, each consisting of one short (or unstressed) syllable followed by one long (or stressed) syllable, for example Two households, both alike in dignity.

Prose - written or spoken language in its ordinary form, without metrical structure.

Context

Society: There was a clear social hierarchy in Elizabethan times with the monarchy ruling over lower classes.

Women's Roles: Women were seen as second class citizens and often women's roles were played by men in Shakespearean plans.

Beliefs: Christianity was the main belief and people were supernatural, believing in witches, who they blamed for any natural disaster.

Theatre: Plays were performed in The Globe Theatre, a round wooden building.

Language: Shakespeare invented much of the words we use today – 1700 of them!

Key Villains

Tybalt	Ruthless and vengeful cousin of the Capulet family. Has a deep, violent hatred of the Montagues and a strong sense of honour and loyalty.
Lady Macbeth	The power-hungry , bloodthirsty wife of Macbeth. Stronger and more ruthless than her husband.
Caliban	Son of the witch Sycorax. Kept as a slave, he is insolent and rebellious and is only controlled through the use of magic.
Claudius	Kills Hamlet's father to become King of Denmark and marry the queen. Devises

a plan to kill Hamlet, who is a threat.
