KEY WORDS:


- Contraception** = methods to stop someone becoming pregnant. 2 types - natural + artificial.
- Procreation** = making/having children.
- Polygamy** = having more than one wife at the same time.
- Abstinence** = Not having sex.
- Chastity** = abstaining from marriage and sex.

CHRISTIAN ATTITUDES TOWARDS PRE-MARITAL SEX:

- Many Christians still believe the purpose of sex is to have children → Sex should only be in a stable marriage (RC)
- Other Christians now accept sex before marriage and cohabitation as sensible options (CofE)
- "The Silver Ring Thing" = An American Christian group. Believe sex is sacred and should be saved for marriage.

CONTRACEPTION

- RC - Against God's natural law. Purpose of sex is to have children.
- Protestants = allow Contraception for control and size of family.

- Cath = life is sacred

- Gender prejudice – unfairly judging someone based on their gender.
- Divorce – Legal ending of a marriage.
- Annulment – Cancelling a marriage saying it never existed. (R.C.)
- Re marriage – people have been married before.

- △ Women are helpers to men. Belief based on Adam + Eve story / Genesis
- △ Many women take on the traditional role of home keepers

△ They believe men + woman are created equally by God.


△ They should have equal opportunities at work + home.

Relationships & families

Divorce

- R.C. does not allow divorce. Marriage is a sacrament for life. Vows said at marriage ceremony can not be broken. Do allow for annulments.



Most non Catholics will allow divorce in some circumstances i.e. violence or adultery. Based on belief God is forgiving + knows the best now. Remarriage w/ 4 to the next.

In the C of E women have been allowed to be priests since 1992 and Bishops since 2014.

Quakers have allowed women to speak at meetings since the 1600s.

WOMEN PRIESTS

& BISHOPS

R.C. and Evangelical Protestants do not allow female leaders.

The believe Jesus + the disciples were male.

Therefore leaders should be male.



Human Sexuality

KEY WORDS:

Agape - Greek word for selfless love
Heterosexual - to be sexually attracted to members of the opposite sex
Homosexuality - to be sexually attracted to members of the same sex
Sexual orientation - which gender/sex someone is attracted to.
Marriage - a legal joining of 2 people

CHRISTIAN ATTITUDES TO HOMOSEXUALITY.

FOR

- Some Christians believe the Bible is dated and so sections about homosexuality is misinterpreted.
- Many Christians believe God created us all differently including our sexuality. We are therefore all equal and loved by God.
- Quakers fully accept homosexual couples at their meetings



AGAINST.

- = Children should have both a male and female role model.
- = Roman Catholic Christians are taught the purpose of sex is to have children. This is not possible for a homosexual couple.
- Some Christians believe God created us male and female to have relationships with each other.

Marriage is a SACRAMENT (an act of worship that shows a spiritual change). Therefore marriage is very important to many Christians.

Which is why many Christians are against COMBINATION (living together but not married)



The vows are promises that the couple will be faithful and support one another for life.

Muslim Responses

Muslims cannot refuse peace if it is offered. If the other side wants to they have to.

Inner Peace-being fully obedient to Allah and being a good Muslim is most important.

How Muslims Promote Peace

Muslim Peace fellowship works to promote peace within Islam.

Islam is a peaceful religion but not racist. They allow violence in Self-defence.

Compare with

"Do not contribute to your destruction with your own hands but do good for God loves those who do good."

God created all life on Earth. We must protect the environment.

Muslim Response To Violence

It is acceptable to fight in self-defence or for a just cause.

"Do not kill each other, for God is merciful to you."

You will 'suffer fine' if you fight out of hostility and injustice.

When is war acceptable?



GREED: God does not like arrogant, boastful people. War to gain something is unacceptable.



I HAD GREATER

A Muslim's internal struggle to be the best



RETALIATION: Can be acceptable but never too harsh. Allah understands the need for justice but forgiveness is the best option.



SELF-DEFENCE: Acceptable if you are protecting the weak and innocent.



Peace and Conflict

Muslim possible. This may include fulfilling the 5 pillars correctly.

LESSER: The struggle to defend Islam from threat. It cannot be used against innocent people so would not allow terrorism.

Muslim Aid have set up the Beity orphanage in Turkey to look after people escaping from Syria. First help them food, water + shelter.

Quakers

QUAKER
are a group of Christians

who believe in no violence at all. They will not allow violence in self-defence.

ARGUMENTS FOR PACIFISM

Quakers believe you can fight for what is right in different ways without using violence.

Jesus said "blessed are the peace makers!"

Christianity

has always been a religion of peace.

Some pacifists have been accused of cowardice. Men refusing to fight were handed white feathers.

Compare with

The Bible says that money is the root of all evil. It would not be ok to fight for gain, only self-defence.

The NT says not to be afraid of war because they will take place.

"Turn the other cheek" used to settle individual disputes but doesn't work in war which involves lots of people.

St Paul says to live in peace with everyone "if possible"

"A time for love and a time for war." suggests sometimes it is time for war.

Protect Terrorism + WMD:

★ Some things are worth fighting for but you can fight without violence. **MLK** is a great example of this.

★ Nuclear weapons cannot be used but can act as a good **deterrent**.

★ "Live at peace with everyone means no **terrorism**. It harms innocent people."

★ Some Christians may justify violence against atrocities i.e. to stop Hitler.



Helping the Victims of War:



Caritas → Catholic Aid Agency who help all over the world.

★ Working during the Syrian Civil War to help rehome refugees.

★ They work to give out food, hygiene, medical care, clothes

★ The Pope said Christians should do this because "The greatest gift we can offer one another is love."

Just War Theory - History:

Man with his book and church: ST Thomas Aquinas!




1: Early Christians = **Pacifist** but Romans needed their army.

2: Key philosophers **Augustine** and **Aquinas** came up with a theory to allow Christians to be peaceful but still fight.

3: They said leaders are chosen by God so if a leader says war is ok, then it is supported by God.



Peace and Conflict





KEY WORDS:

- war** → fighting between nations to resolve issues.
- Peace** → An absence of conflict and fighting.
- Justice** → bringing about what is right and fair.
- Holy War** → A war fought in the name of religion.
- Weapons of Mass Destruction** → WMD - weapons that kill large numbers indiscriminately.

Nuclear Weapons:

Debate: Should countries have weapons capable of such destruction?
Do they act as a good deterrent?

Should we take into account the destruction of the environment

At the moment, there is a civil war in Syria. Many countries in the world are involved. Some chemical weapons have been used!



Issues Surrounding War

Theory used internationally to figure out if a potential war is justified. It gives conditions such as:

- Is the war declared by the right authority?
- Is there a good reason for the war? Not greed or revenge.
- Is there a good chance of success?

Many have argued that WW2 was justified as it was important to remove the threat of Hitler and the Nazis.

Just War Theory:

KEY WORDS:

- Protest** → An expression of disapproval.
- Terrorism** → The use of violence against innocent people to incite fear for a particular cause.
- Radicalisation** → the process of causing someone to adopt radical positions on political + social issues
- Extremism** → Holding extreme political or religious views.

Terrorism:

A very extreme form of protest. Use of violence to spread fear. Not supported by any religions. Causes widespread devastation and destruction



What is worth fighting for?



Protest: → A right to protest in the UK - but not violently.
→ peaceful Protest can turn violent if people feel threatened.
→ A riot is an out of control protest.



Radicalisation:

Extreme religious or political groups attempt to convert others to their cause. They may do this online and persuade others to join them.



Examples:

- MLK - peaceful protest to increase black rights
- Bonhoeffer - allow violence to remove bigger issues - Hitler
