



For the cockerel has crowed.









Died: 1827, Vienna, Austria

Learnt the violin as a child

Started losing his hearing aged 25

Worked for several princes (patronage)

Three periods of composition:
Early – getting established in Vienna
Middle – Heroic, overcoming difficulty
Late – highly intense music

SYMPHONY — piece of music for orchestra
Beethoven wrote 9 symphonies
Symphony No. 6 was his 'Pastoral' - about the countryside

PIANO SONATA — piece of music for solo piano. Beethoven wrote 32 piano sonatas

First symphony to involve
an orchestra and a choir
Ode to Joy is sung

Theme from Symphony No. 5

Famous four note pattern
'Fate knocking at the door'
Played by an orchestra

Fur Elise

Composed for a girl called Elise ('For Elise') Played on the piano

Moonlight Sonata

Played on the piano named (after his death) Moonlight Sonata after a music critic described the effect of the music as moonlight shining on the lake
