DEATH PENALTY TIMELINE:

- In 1900 death penalty available for 4 crimes.
- 1908 / 1933 hanging of under 16s/18s ended.
- 1922 Infanticide Act
- Miscarriages of justice / controversial executions: 1950 Timothy Evans; 1953 Derek Bentley; 1956 Ruth Ellis.
- 1957 Homicide Act restrictions
- 1965 Murder Act + 1969 Amendment ends use of death penalty;
- 1998 final abolition.

Suggested composition:

1st paragraph: <u>Setting</u> - Where in Greece is it set? (mountains, sea, forest) Which characters are in the setting? (What do they look like? Are they brave? Special powers? e.g. ability to fly, super-human strength)

2nd paragraph: <u>Build up:</u> What clue is given? (Is there a warning from the gods? Is someone 'angered'? Are they jealous?)

3rd paragraph: <u>Dilemma:</u> What does the villain do? Appearance (e.g. half animal, serpent), actions (e.g. turn people to stone)

4th Paragraph: Event: Do they battle? Where? (swords, fire, axes or magic)

5th paragraph: <u>Resolution:</u> How do they defeat the villain? How do the gods react?
