Carnegie Award

Seven Year 9 students represented Exmouth Community College at the Carnegie Shadowing Group celebration in The Bookery, Crediton.

The Carnegie and Kate Greenaway Medals are the UK's longest running and best-loved children's book awards, recognising outstanding reading experiences created through writing and illustration in books for children and young people. The seven students who took part were put forward by their English teachers. As a Shadowing group they had to read the eight shortlisted books and decided which they would like to champion. Their group was



called 'Carnegie and Cake' and met weekly for two months in the library to discuss and prepare for the presentations, immersing themselves into the characters. They chose to champion 'Tsunami Girl' by Julian Sedgwick and 'Punching the Air' by Izi Zoboi.

At 'The Bookery' they presented to two other schools from Devon and a group of librarians and teachers. Their presentation took the format of the 6.00pm news, featuring the two main characters and their experiences of either the Tsunami in Japan in 2011 or Amal wrongly convicted by a biased system. Their performance was gritty, emotional, and captivating.
