### Holocaust Memorial Day

On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> January a group of year 8 'Lead Learner' students took part in events at Exeter to mark Holocaust Memorial Day. In the morning there was an opening ceremony in the Cathedral and a talk given by Rob Rinder about his family's experience of the suffering that took place. Later on in the day students learnt more about Kindertransport children and the Nazi genocide of the Gypsy and Roma people.

In their RPE lessons students have been learning about prejudice, discrimination and religious responses to the Holocaust. This was therefore a moving way to further understand the effect normal people can have on the lives of others.

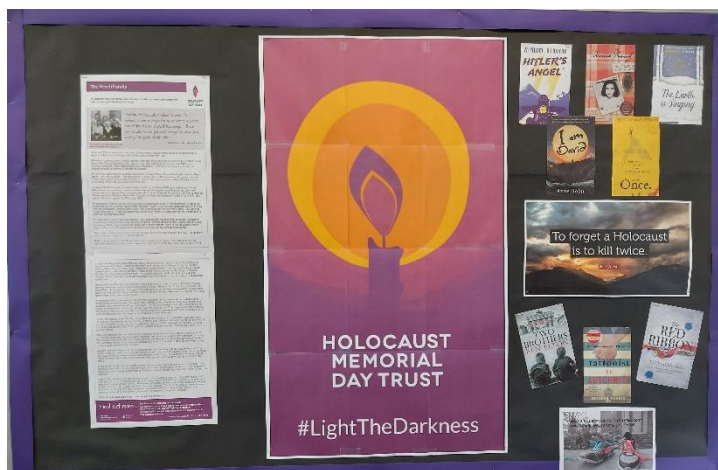




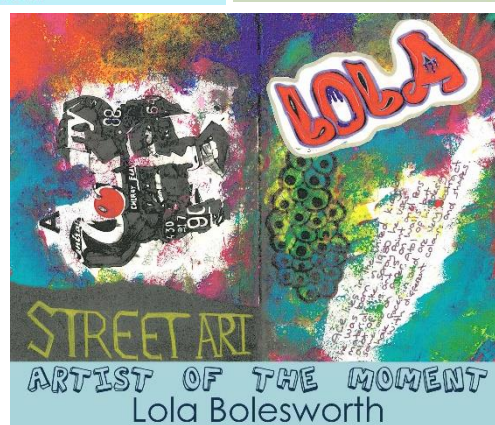
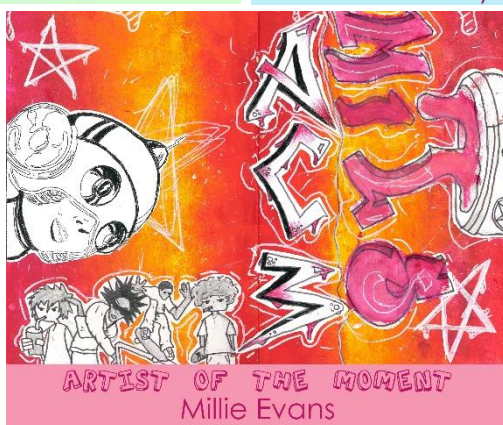
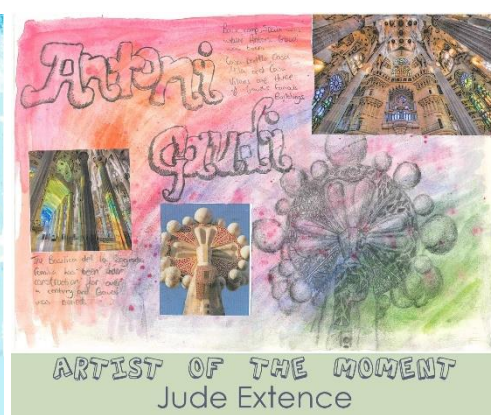
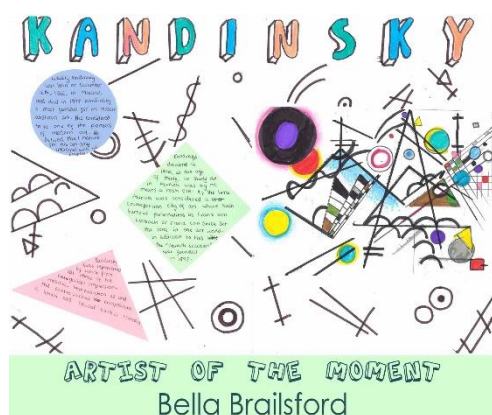
