## The Opening of The Elizabeth Lee Building

The return to College from the Easter holiday was a very exciting one for all students and staff as we took ownership of The Elizabeth Lee Building on Green Close. The building was funded as part of the Priority Build Project for schools costing close to £13,000,000. We are delighted with the much needed investment, which has been nearly ten years in planning and took two years to build.

Over that time several staff have worked tirelessly to ensure the building provides the best learning and working environments for both students and staff. We are also extremely pleased to offer the building up for community use.

The building houses classrooms for humanities subjects, ICT suites, three Drama studios, a theatre, a library, Food and Nutrition classrooms, Design Technology rooms, Science labs and our Key Stage 3 Achievement Hub. All with state of the art facilities, including up to date technology.

We officially open The Elizabeth Lee Building next week during which students will take part in workshops with The Royal Marine Band and also Le Navet Bete Theatre Company.


#### **Year 13 Chemists Take Silver and Bronze**

Year 13 Chemistry students Alberta Sprague and Kirsten Waller have achieved Silver and Bronze awards in this year's Royal Society of Chemistry International Chemistry Olympiad. This year saw more than 11,000 students attempt this extremely challenging 2-hour exam based activity. Students were required to apply their knowledge and understanding to many real-life chemistry examples. Securing silver and bronze awards put Alberta and Kirsten in the top 30% and 70% of this prestigious group respectively, and they deserve huge congratulations for their effort and resilience in undertaking this on top of all their other commitments.

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#### Ten Tors

The popularity of the Ten Tors programme has increased significantly over the last few years. In October last year we had over 60 students from Year 10 and 11 sign up to join us for an initial navigation skills session in school, followed by a walk on Woodbury Common where they were able to put those skills in practice.

Between November 2022 and March 2023 the students undertook several day expeditions on Dartmoor and with each the distance, weight they were carrying and technical difficulty gradually increased. The students became more independent in their ability to route plan, navigate, and manage group morale. There were several classroom sessions in between the day expeditions where we were able to teach more advanced navigation skills, first aid and kit care. We were so impressed with the grit and determination that this cohort demonstrated throughout the first stage of training.



At the end of March we moved on to the second training stage and introduced the first weekend expedition which included



efficiently set up camp and prepare food and this experience paid dividends when the heavens opened just as we arrived at camp. We were really impressed with just how much care they took of each other, helping others to get their tents erected and making sure everyone quickly got a hot meal.

Our final expedition in April gave us a chance to refine the teams and

Our final expedition in April gave us a chance to refine the teams and introduce some micro navigation skills. The teams were looking really strong: they walked well, they navigated well, they set up camp well, and they remained cheerful and determined. They were

the first of two wild camps. This is always a big step up from the day walks but, despite heavier packs, a much longer route and some inclement weather, the students remained remarkably strong. They had been given a session at school where they were taught how to

ready.

When the event weekend arrived we had already been up to Dartmoor to set up a basecamp so that when we took the students up there on the Friday it was all ready for them. We had three 35mile teams and one 45 mile team. The teams had been given their route allocations and spent the Friday afternoon carefully refining their route plans and checking kit. We cooked them dinner and they retired to bed early in preparation for the 5am wakeup call. On the Saturday morning, fuelled by porridge and sausage baps, we walked them up to the start line along with 2400 nervous and excited participants from all over the South West. The cannon fired to signal the start of the event and off they went on their great adventure.



On the Sunday morning we could not have been prouder to see all of our teams to arrive back into the camp to such a hero's welcome, and all of them in such good spirits. Thousands of spectators lined the walk in to cheer our teams on in those last few hundred yards.

We are so proud of all of our amazing Ten Tors participants, and all of those students who trained with us along the way.
